Disclosure regarding conflict of interest – investment banking services

Clarksons Securities AS ("CS") aims always to operate in compliance with appropriate business standards, including with respect to conflicts of interests, the content of reports produced by investment firms and other applicable regulatory standards. To limit potential conflicts of interests, analysts within CS' research department are separated from the corporate finance department in order to control the flow of information ("Chinese walls") and are subject to internal rules on the handling of inside information, other confidential information, unpublished research material and contact with other departments.

These disclosures have been issued pursuant to the requirements set out in Article 6(1)(c)(ii) and Article 6(1)(c)(iii) of Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2016/958.
