Sub-Agency Terms and Conditions

V:3:16Sept2024 Effective 16 September 2024

1. Appointment - Term

- 1.1 Clarksons appoints the Sub Agent as its non-exclusive agent to provide Services to the Principal. Nothing in this Agreement is to be construed as (i) establishing an exclusive arrangement between the parties; or (ii) a guarantee or representation to the Sub Agent that Clarksons will order or obtain any minimum amount of Services.
- 1.2 The duration of the Appointment shall be the length of the vessel's stay.

2. Sub Agent's Obligations

- 2.1 The Sub Agent undertakes and agrees with Clarksons at all times during the performance of the Services:
- 2.1.1 to act towards Clarksons and the Principal conscientiously and in good faith and not to allow its interests to conflict with the duties that it owes to Clarksons or Principal under this Agreement and any Applicable Laws;
- 2.1.2 act in accordance with the standard expected of a first class agent;
- 2.1.3 to act within the scope of the authority granted to it under this Agreement only;
- 2.1.4 to carry out its duties with reasonable dispatch;
- 2.1.5 except as authorised by Clarksons, not to act in a way which will incur any liability on behalf of Clarksons or to pledge the credit of Clarksons;
- 2.1.6 use its best endeavours to comply at all times with any reasonable and specific instructions which Clarksons may give;
- 2.1.7 in consultation with Clarksons, to recommend and/or appoint Service Providers and, in relation to such Appointment, the Sub Agent shall inform such Service Providers that the Sub

Agent is acting as agent for the Principal. The Sub Agent shall not have any liability to Clarksons for the negligent acts or defaults of any such persons unless:

- 2.1.7.1 the Sub Agent fails to exercise due care in the Appointment and provision of instructions to any such persons; and/or
- 2.1.7.2 such persons are under the same beneficial ownership as the Sub Agent.
- 2.1.8 to keep Clarksons fully and promptly informed of conditions and developments in the market and the Territory (whether advantageous or disadvantageous) of which it becomes aware and of developments, customers and potential customers, competing products and services and the activities of Clarksons' competitors in the Territory and generally of such information that the Sub Agent is or becomes aware of that an experienced Sub Agent in the industry would reasonably regard as being of interest to Clarksons or Principal and such other information as Clarksons may reasonably request from time to time or as otherwise agreed between the parties; and
- 2.1.9 to comply at all times with any reasonable and specific instructions, policies or guidelines which Clarksons may give, including but not limited those related to data protection, insurance and service delivery.
- 2.2 The Sub Agent shall at all the times comply with and operate under the Clarksons' Supplier Charter, а сору of which can be found at https://www.clarksons.com/media/w2odgx5r/suppliercharter.pdf. If the Sub Agent or any of its agents, subcontractors or employees breaches this Clause 2.2, Clarksons may terminate this Agreement and Engagement Letter with immediate effect. Any termination pursuant to this Clause 2.2 shall be without prejudice to any right or remedy that has already accrued, or subsequently accrues, to Clarksons.
- 2.3 The Sub Agent shall as required by Clarksons from time to time use the applicable IT systems for port call management and quality assurance at the Sub Agent's cost, if applicable.
- 2.4 The Sub Agent shall co-operate and provide assistance to Clarksons and Principal (and their auditors) in conducting periodic audits of all relevant documentation and processes relating to the Services (including, without limitation, making available its accounts and financial records and statements relating to this Agreement for inspection by Clarksons and/or Principal), provided that Clarksons gives 7 day(s) written notice to the Sub Agent before conducting such audit. Such audit right shall survive termination or expiry for a further period of six (6) years from the date of termination or expiry.



- 2.5 Immediately acquaint Clarksons with relevant local custom or practice and to furnish Clarksons with a copy of the local general conditions if any. Sub Agent shall advise Clarksons of all amendments to port tariffs and other charges and regulations as they become known.
- 2.6 Undertake e-learning when directed by Clarksons, if applicable.
- 2.7 The Sub Agent will remove any member of personnel from the Services immediately upon direction of Clarksons.
- 2.8 The Sub Agent shall pay Service Providers in full and on time.
- 2.9 The Sub Agent shall not place any liens on Principal's or Principal's Affiliates vessels or goods in connection with the Services unless approved by Clarksons in writing.
- 2.10 The Sub Agent shall pass on to Clarksons the benefit of all Service Provider discounts, commissions, bonuses and rebates.
- 2.11 The Sub Agent shall produce all documentation needed in a format and within a timeframe specified by Clarksons in respect to, without limitation: systems, compliance, policies, procedures, licenses.
- 2.12 The Sub Agent shall maintain its information technology systems and policies and procedures as reasonably expected of an international port agency company.
- 2.13 The Sub Agent warrants that all staff are competent and experienced and appropriately qualified to perform the Services.
- 2.14 The Sub Agent shall keep Clarksons in copy on all correspondence with the Principal.
- 2.15 The Sub Agent shall use reasonable endeavours to facilitate an efficient handover in the event this Agreement or the Engagement Letter are terminated.
- 2.16 The Sub Agent shall use those templates in the performance of its obligations as reasonably directed by Clarksons.
- 2.17 The Sub Agent shall immediately notify Clarksons in the event it has or has reason to believe it may be listed on a sanctions or prohibitions list.
- 2.18 The Sub Agent shall immediately notify Clarksons in the event it has or has reason to believe it will lose or change the terms of its operating license.
- 2.19 The Sub Agent shall provide all supporting documentation along with all submitted invoices.



- 2.20 The Sub Agent shall, with respect to the processing of personal data, comply with GDPR or applicable Data Protection Legislation.
- 2.21 The Sub Agent shall comply and ensure that all Sub Agent's Affiliates, contractors (of any tier) and agents engaged by or acting on Sub Agent's behalf complies with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the Convention on the Rights of the Child, the International Labour Organization's Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work and all laws, rules, conventions, treaties, regulations and directives of a similar nature.

3. Services

- 3.1 The Sub Agent undertakes and agrees to provide the following services to Clarksons and Principal when requested by Clarksons and/or Principal:
- 3.1.1 to arrange for berthing of vessels, loading and discharging of the cargo;
- 3.1.2 to arrange and co-ordinate all activities of Service Providers, in the interest of obtaining the best possible operation, price and safe and timely despatch of the vessels for which Clarksons is appointed agent;
- 3.1.3 to arrange for calling forward, reception and loading of outward cargo and discharge and release of inward cargo and to attend to the transhipment of through cargo;
- 3.1.4 to arrange for bunkering, repairs, husbandry, crew changes, passengers, ship's stores, spare parts and technical, nautical and medical assistance;
- 3.1.5 to co-operate and assist Clarksons with its requirements concerning claims handling, P&I matters, general average and/or insurance, and the appointment of surveyors;
- 3.1.6 to attend to all necessary documentation and to attend to consular requirements;
- 3.1.7 to arrange for and attend to the clearance of the vessel and to arrange for all other services pertaining to the vessel's movements through the port;
- 3.1.8 to report to Clarksons the vessel's position and to prepare a statement of facts of the call and/or a port log;
- 3.1.9 to keep Clarksons regularly and timely informed on port and working conditions likely to affect the despatch of vessels; and
- 3.1.10 any other service reasonably expected to be performed by a port agent.



3.2 The Sub Agent shall provide the Services to Clarksons and the Principal as an independent contractor and not as Clarkson's or the Principal's employee. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute, or be deemed to constitute, a partnership or joint venture between Clarksons, the Agent or the Principal for any purpose.

4. Accounting and Finance

- 4.1 The Sub Agent undertakes and agrees with Clarksons at all times during the Term:
- 4.1.1 to properly maintain in accordance with generally accepted international accounting practice all records of Clarksons' financial position concerning the obligations undertaken by the Sub Agent under this Agreement on Clarksons' behalf and to make such records promptly available for inspection by Clarksons on request; and
- 4.1.2 to check all vouchers received from Service Providers and to prepare promptly a proper, accurate and true disbursement account in respect of each voyage or accounting period in an agreed format, with timing and delivery as per Clarksons' instructions or if there are no instructions, as reasonably expected.
- 4.2 The Sub Agent undertakes to use any funds which have been advanced to the Sub Agent by Clarksons for the disbursements pertaining to the Services only. The Sub Agent shall only utilise such funds towards matters relating to that specific port call for which funds have been advanced and the Sub Agent shall not be entitled to set-off such funds against any other claims, dues or other matters in dispute that the Sub Agent has towards Clarksons or Clarksons Affiliate or Principal or Principal Affiliate, nor shall the Sub Agent be entitled to appropriate such funds towards any other liabilities of the Sub Agent in its business.

5. Clarksons' Obligations

- 5.1 Clarksons undertakes and agrees with the Sub Agent that it shall:
- 5.1.1 give full and timely information regarding vessel's schedules and ports of call insofar as it affects the Services; and
- 5.1.2 provide the Sub Agent with all necessary funds to cover advance disbursements or as otherwise agreed by the parties in writing from time to time (including the Engagement Letter).



5.2 Clarksons shall provide such access and training to its proprietary IT and other systems as Clarksons deems appropriate to enable the Sub Agent to perform the Services (including the port call management, reporting and quality assurance) in accordance with this Agreement.

6. Remuneration

- 6.1 Clarksons agrees to pay the Sub Agent remuneration for the Services as agreed between the parties in the Engagement Letter. The Sub Agent acknowledges that Clarksons shall only be liable to pay any amounts due hereunder when such corresponding amounts have been received by Clarksons from Principal.
- 6.2 The remuneration is in respect of the anticipated duties of the Sub Agent within the scope of this Agreement.
- 6.3 The price is deemed inclusive of all taxes and charges including, communication, faxing, photocopying and courier costs.
- 6.4 Clarksons may withhold taxes pursuant to its obligation under Applicable Law.
- 6.5 Clarksons may retain payment of such funds pursuant to its obligation under Applicable Law.
- 6.6 Clarksons may offset any amount owed to Sub Agent against any outstanding debt or liability pursuant to any agreement (including this Agreement) owed to Clarksons or Clarksons Affiliate.
- 6.7 Payment to Sub Agent from Clarksons shall not be construed as acceptance of the Services and in no way shall such payment be deemed a waiver of any Clarksons or Clarksons Affiliate's rights.
- 6.8 Sub Agent acknowledges that Sub Agent shall invoice Clarksons before Clarksons can make payment of funds to Sub Agent.
- 6.9 Clarksons shall settle any amounts due in accordance with the 'Payment Terms' section of the Engagement Letter.

7. Insurance

7.1 The Sub Agent shall effect and maintain at all times throughout the Services and for a period of six (6) years following the termination or expiry of this Agreement, such insurances as would ordinarily be maintained by a reasonably prudent agent in the Sub Agent's industry,



profession or trade with a reputable insurer(s), including the following insurances in amounts not less than the cover limits set out below to cover the liabilities that may arise under or in connection with this Agreement:

- 7.1.1 Professional Indemnity: USD 10m or equivalent;
- 7.1.2 Employers Liability: Statutory limits;
- 7.1.3 Workers Compensation Cover: Statutory Limits;
- 7.1.4 Public and Products Liability: USD 10m or equivalent; and
- 7.1.5 Any other covers relevant to the contract for specialist services: up to USD 10m or equivalent.
- 7.2 The Sub Agent shall provide Clarksons with a broker's letter no later than seven (7) days after singing the Engagement Letter, or at any other time upon request by Clarksons, stating:
- 7.2.1 the names of the insurers providing cover;
- 7.2.2 the dates of cover; and
- 7.2.3 and the provided limits of cover.
- 7.3 The Sub Agent shall provide thirty (30) days' prior written notice to Clarksons of any changes and/or cancellations to its insurance policies referenced above. If, for whatever reason, the Sub Agent fails to give effect to and maintain the insurances required by this Agreement, Clarksons may make alternative arrangements to protect its interests and may recover the costs of such arrangements from the Sub Agent.

8. Liability and Indemnification

- 8.1 Nothing in this Agreement shall limit or exclude the liability of either party for:
- 8.1.1 death or personal injury resulting from negligence;
- 8.1.2 fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation; and/or
- 8.1.3 any liability which cannot be limited or excluded by Applicable Laws.
- 8.2 Subject to Clause 8.1, the Sub Agent's total liability whether in contract, tort (including negligence or breach of statutory duty), misrepresentation, restitution or otherwise arising in connection with the performance or contemplated performance of this Agreement shall not



in any circumstances exceed, per event or series of related events, the amount of loss incurred by Clarksons or the amount of one million US dollars (\$1,000,000), whichever is higher.

- 8.3 Subject to Clause 8.1, Clarksons's total liability whether in contract, tort (including negligence or breach of statutory duty), debt, misrepresentation, restitution or otherwise arising in connection with the performance or contemplated performance of this Agreement shall not in any circumstances exceed, per event or series of related events, the amount of five hundred thousand US dollars (\$500,000).
- 8.4 Subject to Clause 8.1, under no circumstances shall Clarksons be liable to the Sub Agent for any of the following types of loss or damage arising under or in relation to this Agreement or Services (whether arising from breach of contract, misrepresentation (whether tortious or statutory), tort (including but not limited to negligence), breach of statutory duty, or otherwise):
- 8.4.1 any loss of profits, business, contracts, anticipated savings, goodwill, or revenue, any wasted expenditure, any loss of market, any loss, delay or expense arising from detention or delay of a vessel or any loss or corruption of data (regardless of whether any of these types of loss or damage are direct, indirect, special or consequential); or
- 8.4.2 any indirect, special or consequential loss or damage whatsoever, even if Clarksons and/or the Sub Agent were aware of the possibility that such loss or damage might be incurred.
- 8.5 Subject to Clause 8.1, under no circumstances shall Sub Agent be liable to Clarksons for any indirect, special or consequential loss whatsoever, arising under or in relation to this Agreement or Services (whether arising from breach of contract, misrepresentation (whether tortious or statutory), tort (including but not limited to negligence), breach of statutory duty, or otherwise).
- 8.6 Subject to Clause 8.1, Clause 8.4, and Clause 8.7, Clarksons shall indemnify the Sub Agent against all liabilities, costs, expenses, damages, damage and losses (including any reasonable legal and other professional costs and expenses) ("**Losses**") suffered or incurred by the Sub Agent during the Term:
- 8.6.1 arising out of the proper performance of the Sub Agent's duties in accordance with this Agreement; and/or
- 8.6.2 in respect of any bonds, guarantees and any other forms of security provided by the Sub Agent to customs or other statutory authorities in accordance with this Agreement.



- 8.7 The indemnity in Clause 8.6 shall not extend to matters arising by reason of the negligence or wilful misconduct of the Sub Agent. Subject to Clause 8.5, the Sub Agent shall remain fully liable to Clarksons and/or the relevant third party in respect of any Losses suffered or incurred by the Sub Agent where the same arise out of the Sub Agent's negligence or wilful misconduct.
- 8.8 Subject to Clause 8.1 the Sub Agent shall indemnify Clarksons and the Clarksons Affiliates against all Losses suffered or incurred by Clarksons arising out of:
- 8.8.1 the Sub Agent breaching any Applicable Laws;
- 8.8.2 any claim or Losses from the Principal or any third party (including the draw down on bank guarantees) arising out of the Sub Agent's breach of this Agreement, negligence or wilful misconduct; or
- 8.8.3 Sub Agent's breach of this Agreement, negligence or wilful misconduct.

9. Confidentiality

- 9.1 Sub Agent undertakes to keep confidential any Confidential Information which it obtains under or in connection with this Agreement and not to use such information or disclose it to any other person, other than as permitted under Clause 10.2.
- 9.2 Clause 9.1 shall not apply to the disclosure of Confidential Information:
- 9.2.1 which relates to cargos and which the Sub Agent reasonably needs to disclose in order to carry out its duties in accordance with this Agreement;
- 9.2.2 which is disclosed with the consent of Clarksons;
- 9.2.3 or if and to the extent that: (A) such disclosure is required by Applicable Laws; (B) such disclosure is required by any competent regulatory authority or recognised stock exchange; or (C) such Confidential Information is in the public domain other than through breach of this Clause 9, provided that any Confidential Information shall only be disclosed pursuant to this Clause 9.2 by Sub Agent after notification to Clarksons to which the information relates if such notification is reasonably practicable in the circumstances.
- 9.3 Upon written request, Sub Agent shall promptly return to Clarksons all Confidential Information then in the Sub Agent's possession or control, including any copies of the same.



10. Information

- 10.1 In relation to any Information supplied by the Sub Agent pursuant to Clause 2.1.8, the Sub Agent hereby grants to Clarksons and the Clarksons Affiliates a nonexclusive, worldwide, royalty-free, perpetual, transferable licence to use the Information in any format for the Permitted Purpose.
- 10.2 The Sub Agent warrants, represents and undertakes that, to the best of its knowledge and belief:
- 10.2.1 all Information supplied by it: (A) may be used freely by Clarksons and the Clarksons Affiliates for the Permitted Purpose; (B) is true, complete and accurate; and (C) is not defamatory, libellous or otherwise provided with malicious intent;
- 10.2.2 it has all rights, consents, permissions and licences to license the receipt and use of the Information to Clarksons and the Clarksons Affiliates as contemplated in this Agreement; and
- 10.2.3 the use of the Information by Clarksons and/or the Clarksons Affiliates shall not: (A) infringe the rights, including the Intellectual Property Rights, of any third party; (B) breach any obligations of confidentiality owed by the Sub Agent or any other person; or (C) breach any Applicable Laws, and the Sub Agent warrants that it has undertaken reasonable efforts to verify the accuracy of these statements and it shall inform Clarksons as soon as reasonably practicable if it becomes aware that any of the matters described in this Clause 10.2 become untrue.
- 10.3 For the avoidance of doubt, the Sub Agent acknowledges and agrees that the remuneration payable to it by Clarksons as agreed in accordance with Clause 6 of this Agreement is the only payment due to it in respect of the Sub Agent's services and that:
- 10.3.1 unless otherwise agreed by the parties in writing, no royalty payment or any other additional form of financial compensation shall be due to the Sub Agent or any other party from Clarksons and/or any of the Clarksons Affiliates in respect of the supply of Information by the Sub Agent; and
- 10.3.2 to the best of its knowledge and belief, no tax, levy, duty or charge shall be payable by Clarksons and/or any of the Clarksons Affiliates relating to state, government or any similar authority for Clarksons and/or the Clarksons Affiliates to use the Information for the Permitted Purpose, at any time now or in the future.



11. Termination

- 11.1 Clarksons may terminate this Agreement with immediate effect if the Sub Agent commits a breach of its obligations under this Agreement which (a) cannot be remedied or (b) remains unremedied for a period of seven (7) days following written notice by Clarksons.
- 11.2 Either party may terminate this Agreement with immediate effect by giving written notice to the other party if the other party:
- 11.2.1 is declared bankrupt, becomes insolvent, is unable to pay debts or enters into an arrangement with its creditors; or
- 11.2.2 has a petition presented, an order made or a resolution passed for its liquidation (otherwise than for the purposes of a solvent amalgamation or reconstruction), administration, bankruptcy or dissolution or if an administrative or other receiver, manager, trustee, liquidator, administrator or similar officer is appointed to the other party and/or over all or any part of the assets of the other party.
- 11.3 Termination or expiry of this Agreement shall not prejudice any of the parties' rights and remedies which have accrued as at termination or expiry. The rights and obligations of the parties under this Agreement which are intended to continue beyond its termination or expiry shall survive termination or expiry.

12. Notices

- 12.1 Any communications between the parties, including in relation to Clause 22, can be effected electronically via post, electronic mail or fax.
- 12.2 Unless the contrary is proved, each such notice or communication shall be deemed to have been given or made and delivered, if by letter on the second working day after posting.
- 12.3 All notices shall be made out to the relevant address and where provided the contact person listed in the Engagement Letter.

13. Assignment and Subcontracting

13.1 Sub Agent shall not assign or transfer any of its rights, benefits or obligations under this Agreement without Clarksons' prior written consent (such consent not be unreasonably withheld or delayed). Clarksons shall be entitled to assign or novate its rights and obligations



under this Agreement to any Affiliate Sub Agent shall sign all necessary documents to complete such assignment or novation by Clarksons.

13.2 Sub Agent shall not be permitted to sub contract the Services without the prior written consent of Clarksons. In the event Clarksons consents to such sub contracting. Sub Agent shall remain solely liable for the performance and liabilities of such subcontractor.

14. Force Majeure

14.1 If a Force Majeure Event occurs which prevents a party (the "Affected Party") from performing any of its obligations to the other (the "Other Party") the Affected Party shall not be liable to the Other Party and shall be released from its obligations to the extent that its ability to perform such obligations has been affected by the Force Majeure Event, provided that: (i) the lack of ability to perform the obligations caused by the Force Majeure Event could not have been prevented by reasonable precautions; (ii) the Affected Party notifies the Other Party in writing as soon as reasonably practical of the occurrence of the Force Majeure Event and the nature and likely duration of its impact upon the Other Party; (iii) the Affected Party takes all reasonable steps to mitigate the impact of the Force Majeure Event on the Other Party and in particular continues to perform those obligations affected by the Force Majeure Event but whose performance has not been rendered impossible to the highest standard reasonably practicable in the circumstances; and (iv) the Affected Party resumes normal performance of all affected obligations as soon as the impact of the Force Majeure Event ceases, and notifies the Other Party in writing of such resumption. If the impact of the Force Majeure Event upon the Sub Agent prevents it from performing a substantial part of its obligations under this Agreement Clarksons may, by written notice to Sub Agent, terminate this Agreement either in whole or in part with immediate effect and without liability.

15. Ethical Standards

- 15.1 The parties agree that neither party shall:
- 15.1.1 offer or agree to give any person working for or engaged by the other party any gift or other consideration, which could act as an inducement or a reward for any act or omission to act in connection with this Agreement or any other agreement between the parties;
- 15.1.2 enter into this Agreement or any other agreement with the other party if it has knowledge that, in connection with it, any money has been, or will be, paid to any person working for or engaged by the other party or that an agreement has been reached to that effect unless:



(i) details of any such arrangement have been disclosed in writing to the other party prior to the execution of the relevant agreement and; (ii) approval of such arrangement by an authorised representative of the other party has been obtained;

- 15.1.3 offer, pay or promise to pay either directly or indirectly, anything of value to a Public Official in connection with this Agreement. The parties further agree that in the performance of their respective obligations under this Agreement, the parties and their respective agents, subcontractors and employees shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations and orders of any applicable jurisdiction, including the OECD Convention on Combating Bribery of Foreign Public Officials in International Business Transactions. The one party shall notify the other party immediately in writing with full particulars in the event that the first party receives a request from any Public Official requesting illicit payments; or
- 15.1.4 take any other action which results in a breach by either party of any applicable anticorruption legislation.
- 15.2 If either party (including its sub-contractors or employees) breaches Clause 15.1, the other party may terminate the Agreement by written notice with immediate effect. Any termination pursuant to this Clause 15.2 shall be without prejudice to any right or remedy that has already accrued, or subsequently accrues, to either party.

16. Non-Solicitation

- 16.1 The Sub Agent agrees that it shall not without the prior written consent of Clarksons:
- 16.1.1 during the Services and for a period of twelve (12) months after the expiration or any termination of the Agreement offer any services in the Territory to any client or customer for whom Clarksons and/or any Clarksons Affiliate is or has been appointed as agent in the Territory either within the previous twelve (12) months starting from the commencement of the Services or during the term of the Agreement; and
- 16.1.2 during the Services and for a period of two (2) years after the expiration or any termination of the Agreement attempt to directly or indirectly solicit or seek to entice away from Clarksons and/or any Clarksons Affiliate the business or custom of any client or customer for whom Clarksons and/or any Clarksons Affiliate has been appointed as agent in the Territory within the previous twelve (12) months of the date listed in the Engagement Letter or during the term of the Agreement with a view to providing goods or services to that client or customer in competition with Clarksons and/or any Clarksons Affiliate.



16.2 The Sub Agent acknowledges and agrees that the covenants in this Clause 16 are considered fair and reasonable by the Sub Agent. If any restriction shall be found to be unenforceable but would be valid if any part of it were deleted or the period or area of application reduced, the restriction shall apply with such modifications as may be necessary to make it valid and effective.

17. Intellectual Property Rights

- 17.1 The Sub Agent acknowledges and agrees that the Intellectual Property Rights of Clarksons and/or Clarksons Affiliates and/or Principal and Principal Affiliates used on or in relation to services performed by the Sub Agent under this Agreement and Clarksons and Clarksons Affiliates' business and the goodwill connected with that are the sole and exclusive property of Clarksons and/or Clarksons Affiliates and/or Principal and Principal Affiliates.
- 17.2 The Sub Agent acknowledges and agrees that:
- 17.2.1 it is only permitted to use the Intellectual Property for the purposes of and during the term of this Agreement and only as authorised by Clarksons hereunder;
- 17.2.2 other than to that extent, it has and shall have no right to use or to allow others to use the Intellectual Property Rights or any part of it. It shall not seek to register any Intellectual Property Rights on behalf of the Clarksons without Clarksons' express consent;
- 17.2.3 it shall not use any trademarks, trade names or getup which resemble Clarksons and/or Clarksons Affiliates' and/or Principal and Principal Affiliates trademarks, trade names or getup and which would therefore be likely to confuse or mislead the public or any section of the public;
- 17.2.4 it shall not remove, alter or otherwise tamper with any of Clarksons and/or Clarksons Affiliates' and/or Principal and Principal Affiliates trademarks, trade names, logos, numbers or other means of identification on any products or the packaging therefor which come into the Sub Agent's possession, custody or control, and shall not place any trade mark or trade name of its own on any products or any packaging or other materials used in connection therewith;
- 17.2.5 it shall not do or omit to do, or authorise any third party to do or to omit to do, anything which could invalidate or be inconsistent with the Intellectual Property Rights;
- 17.2.6 it shall not make a statement in any advertising material and promotional literature produced by or for it in connection with the services to be performed under this Agreement as to the ownership of any relevant Intellectual Property Rights used or referred to therein; and



17.2.7 not make any statement public or otherwise regarding this Agreement, the Services, the Engagement Letter or Principal.

18. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement (or part of any provision) is found by any court or other authority of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that provision or part-provision shall, to the extent required, be deemed not to form part of this Agreement, and the validity and enforceability of the other provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected.

19. Third Party Rights

- 19.1 A person who is not a party to this Agreement has no right under the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 to enforce or to enjoy the benefit of any term of this Agreement save that, any rights in the Agreement that are stated to be for the benefit of any of the Clarksons Affiliates can be enforced by the relevant Clarksons Affiliates.
- 19.2 The consent of any Clarksons Affiliate or any other third party is not necessary for any variation (including any release or compromise in whole or in part of any liability) or termination.

20. No Waiver

The failure to exercise, or delay in exercising, a right, power or remedy provided by this Agreement or by Applicable Laws shall not constitute a waiver of that right, power or remedy. If either party waives a breach of any provision of this Agreement this shall not operate as a waiver of a subsequent breach of that provision, or as a waiver of a breach of any other provision. Any waiver given by a party must be given in writing and signed by an authorised representative of that party.

21. Governing Law

This Agreement and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with it (including any dispute or claim relating to non-contractual obligations) shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of England and Wales.

22. Arbitration



- 22.1 Any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with this Agreement (including any dispute or claim relating to non-contractual obligations) shall be negotiated between the parties in good faith, should a final settlement to the dispute not be reached within thirty (30) days from the commencement of such negotiations such dispute shall be referred to arbitration and shall be conducted in accordance with the London Maritime Arbitrators Association (LMAA) Terms current at the time when the arbitration proceedings are commenced.
- 22.2 The reference shall be to three arbitrators. A party wishing to refer a dispute to arbitration shall appoint its arbitrator and send notice of such appointment in writing to the other party requiring the other party to appoint its own arbitrator within fourteen (14) calendar days of that notice and stating that it will appoint its arbitrator as sole arbitrator unless the other party appoints its own arbitrator and gives notice that it has done so within the fourteen (14) calendar days specified. If the other party does not appoint its own arbitrator and gives notice that it has done so within the party referring a dispute to arbitration may, without the requirement of any further prior notice to the other party, appoint its arbitrator as sole arbitrator and shall advise the other party accordingly. The award of a sole arbitrator shall be binding on both parties as if he had been appointed by agreement.
- 22.3 Nothing in this Clause 22 shall prevent the parties agreeing in writing to vary these provisions to provide for the appointment of a sole arbitrator. In cases where neither the claim nor any counterclaim exceeds the sum of US\$50,000 (or such other sum as the parties may agree) the arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with the LMAA Small Claims Procedure current at the time when the arbitration proceedings are commenced.

23. Amendment

In order to be effective, any amendment to this Agreement shall be documented in the form of a legal instrument in writing and signed by both parties.

24. Definitions and Interpretation

24.1 The following expressions shall have the following meaning in this Agreement:

"Affiliate" means a company or other legal entity which directly, or indirectly through one or more intermediaries, controls, or is controlled by, or is under common control with, another entity; "control" (including the terms "controls", "controlled by" and "under common control with") means the possession, directly or indirectly, of more than 50% of the equity securities or equity interests in such entity or the power to direct or cause the direction of the management



and policies of such entity (whether through ownership of securities, partnership interest or other ownership interests, by contract, or otherwise);

"**Sub Agent**" means the legal entity engaged by Clarksons to provide the Services pursuant to the Engagement Letter;

"**Agreement**" means the terms and conditions of this agreement (including any document referred to in it) as amended by the parties in writing from time to time;

"**Applicable Laws**" means any laws, rules and regulations applicable to Clarksons, the Sub Agent or the Services;

"**Appointment**" means the engagement by Clarksons of the Sub Agent to perform Services to a Principal pursuant to this Agreement;

"Clarksons" means (as applicable) Clarkson Port Services Limited or the Affiliate which is listed in the Engagement Letter;

"**Confidential Information**" means, in relation to Clarksons, all information of a confidential nature not known to the public relating to the business and/or operations of Clarksons or its Affiliates (whether such information is disclosed in writing, by delivery of items, orally, by visual presentation, by means of providing access to such information (when, for example, the information is contained on a database or otherwise)) including but not limited to: (i) any such information subsisting in any Intellectual Property Rights; (ii) any such information which is commercially sensitive or price sensitive; (iii) any such information about the business, customers, suppliers, finances, systems or other affairs; and (iv) the provisions and subject matter of this Agreement and the Engagement Letter;

"**Data Protection Legislation**" means (as they relate to this Agreement) (i) the General Data Protection Regulation (EU/2016/679) ("**GDPR**") and any relevant subordinate legislation in the UK unless and until the GDPR is no longer directly applicable in the UK, and then (ii) any successor legislation to the Data Protection Act 1998.

"Engagement Letter" means the document titled 'Sub Sub Agent Engagement Letter' signed by both Clarksons and the Sub Agent in which establishes the mechanism to be able to utilize this Agreement except in the event there is not a document titled 'Sub Sub Agent Engagement Letter' signed by both Clarksons and the Sub Agent, in which case any reference to 'Engagement Letter' shall be deemed a reference to the Standing Instructions;

"Force Majeure Event" means an event, including the following: acts of god, war, explosions, fires, bad weather, floods, tempests, earthquake, insurrection, acts of terrorism or terrorist threats, arrest or restraint by princes, rulers and people, closure or congestion of ports, quarantine and epidemics, riot, civil disturbance, rebellion, strike, lock-out or labour dispute but not a strike, lock-out or labour dispute relating to the party relying on the Force Majeure Event; or any other event whatsoever that is beyond the reasonable control of either party;

"Information" means that information provided pursuant to Clause 2.1.8;

"Intellectual Property Rights" means:



- (i) patents, inventions, designs, copyright and related rights, database rights, trade marks and related goodwill, trade names (whether registered or unregistered), and rights to apply for registration;
- (ii) proprietary rights in domain names;
- (iii) knowhow and Confidential Information;
- (iv) applications, extensions and renewals in relation to any of these rights; and
- (v) all other rights of a similar nature or having an equivalent effect anywhere in the world;

"**Permitted Purpose**" means the use by Clarksons and/or the Clarksons Affiliate of the Information for any purpose including the supply of information services to its customers, the copying, issuing of copies, distribution, communication, modification, amendment and adaptation of the Information in any way (including for commercial sales) throughout the world and the granting of sub-licences of the Information;

"Public Official" means:

- (i) any official or employee of any government agency or government-owned or controlled enterprise;
- (ii) any person performing a public function;
- (iii) any official or employee of a public international organisation;
- (iv) any candidate for political office; or
- (v) any political party or an official of a political party;

"**Principal**" means the ship owner or charterer for whom Clarksons is appointed as agent or subagent to perform various services relating to their vessels;

"Service Providers" means stevedores, watchmen, tallymen, hauliers and other third party suppliers recommended and/or engaged by the Sub Agent in the performance of the Services;

"Services" means those obligations outlined in Clause 3.1 and Engagement Letter as requested by Clarksons from Sub Agent;

"**Standing Instructions**" means the email (or its attachment) with subject 'Standing Instructions' from Clarksons to Sub Agent which confirms the Appointment; and

"Territory" means the port(s) identified in the Engagement Letter.

- 24.2 All documentation related to this Agreement shall be made in the English language.
- 24.3 Any phrase in this Agreement introduced by the terms including, include, in particular or any similar expression, shall be construed as illustrative and shall not limit the sense of the words preceding those terms.



- 24.4 A reference to "party" shall mean either Clarksons or Sub Agent. A reference to the "parties" shall mean Clarksons and the Sub Agent.
- 24.5 A reference to writing or written includes faxes and email.
- 24.6 Clause, Conditions, Schedule and paragraph headings shall not affect the interpretation of this Agreement.
- 24.7 A reference to a statute or statutory provision is a reference to it as amended, extended or re-enacted from time to time.
- 24.8 Any obligation on a party not to do something includes an obligation not to allow that thing to be done.
